returning from his Second Novitiate (1958), he taught French at Prevoist High (1959-1972) and Bishop Connolly (1972-1975).

He then launched his second career and in turn served as plant manager in Adrian, Michigan (1975-1977), maintenance worker in Plattsburgh (1977-1985) and Wilton, Me (1991). His work for the Adrian Dominican Sisters was greatly appreciated as expressed by Sr. Rosemary Ferguson, Prioress, "I want to thank you from the bottom of my heart for what you have done and what you have been as a person, as a Brother and as a marvelous worker."

Br. Normand was born in Fall River, Mass. on December 15, 1919, the son of Napoleon Simoneau and Dorilla Roy. He is survived by one sister, Mrs. Annette Nadeau of Windsor Locks, Conn., and many nieces and nephews. A funeral mass was held in Notre Dame Church (Fall River) on Sept. 28 and a Burial Mass at Alfred on Sept 27, 2009. Internment was in the Brothers Cemetery in Alfred.
